How do you know to send flowers?

CDR relies on Development Officers and other members of the Advancement Division to notify us when we have lost a member of our Clemson Family.



Which florist do you recommend?

We recommend **Tiger Lily Flowers & Gifts, LLC**. This local Clemson florist offers wire-out delivery (domestic and international) for home or funeral services. If the delivery is time-sensitive or Tiger Lily is closed, the funeral home can typically recommend a local florist who may be handling other flowers for the family.

Who pays for the flowers?

Flowers orders falling under one of the CDR bulleted areas below will be paid by CDR. Flowers managed by the DO or Team should be charged to the appropriate budget for that DO or Team.

Expense Type is:
Non-taxable gift



What kind of flowers do I send?

Typically we send one of the following:

- Standing spray in the \$175 range (CDR standard)- Mostly orange/purple flowers with white filler (NO carnations) This usually goes to a funeral home or memorial service.
- CLEMSON orange roses arranged in a vase. (\$175 value) This would typically be sent to a person's home.
- You could also chose a large plant. (This choice can be more budget friendly.)

What should the card say?

The CDR standard message is:
Love and prayers, Your Clemson Advancement Family

Development Officer / Team:

- Personal expression to donor or staff member NOT from Advancement
- Donor in portfolio who doesn't fall into CDR category.
